Explain or describe questions – definitions will need to be learnt for all topics				
Explain questions: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• make a point.</li><li>• give a reason why (often given as 'because')</li><li>• state the consequences (positive or negative) for the legal system.</li></ul>				
Discuss questions:  Aim to use five connectives to build analysis chains in a <b>discuss</b> question. Examples of connectives are 'because', 'leading to', 'therefore', 'however', 'the consequence' and 'as a result'.				
<b>Evaluate</b> is the top-level skill that is assessed in a GCSE Business exam. <b>Evaluate</b> questions look for respondents to form an opinion on a given issue and offer a critical response. <b>Evaluate</b> questions often require respondents to use knowledge relating to the topic area and wider knowledge of business to access the top-level marks. <b>Evaluate</b> questions are always linked to a case study and respondents must use this throughout to support their response. A conclusion is always necessary in an <b>evaluate</b> question.
