Why is this course important and what is in the course?

GCSE geography is an interesting and varied course that gives students a broad awareness of how our modern world works and an understanding of the changes occurring in human and physical environments in the UK and globally. We try to incorporate recent examples into our teaching and make the course relevant to our students. If students have an interest in the topics outlined and are aware of geographical events in the news it is much easier to engage with the course content. The GCSE course develops a wide range of <u>transferrable</u> skills and enables students to talk confidently about geographical issues that affect us all.

How will I be assessed in Geography?

The OCR A GCSE consists of three exam papers.

Paper 1 (1 hour) – Living in the UK today <u>focusses</u> on geographical issues in our home environment and we study:

How our landscape in the UK has formed and continues to develop

How the UK population changes in time and a focus on the way we live and where we live. We also study economic change and inequality in our country

How we are impacted by our weather in the UK; how we are having an impact on our environment and how we are trying to ensure a sustainable future with our energy sources.

Paper 2 (1 hour) - The world around us focusses on more global issues:

How different ecosystems and biomes exist in different areas of the planet and how humans are having an impact on them

How people live in different parts of the world and why these differences exist. How we try to reduce inequality between different places.

How climate change happens and how it will impact on our lives; how it could cause weather extremes and finally how we are attempting to reduce its impact or adapt to the changes.

Paper 3 (1 hour 30 minutes) - Skills and fieldwork

This assessment focusses on using geographical skills such as using sources of evidence effectively and interpreting data represented in map or graph form. It also demands that students are able to understand what they learned from their two pieces of fieldwork that they will undertake during their course. We visit an urban area and a coastal area for this and the students will need to confidently collect, present, analyse and notice patterns with the data collected.
