Why is homework important?

- There is a direct link between amount/ effort spent on homework and students attainment.
- EEF research indicates that homework adds the value of 5 months of learning.
- (<u>https://educationendowmentfoundation.org.uk/education-evidence/teaching-learning-toolkit/homework</u>)
- Develops students ability to work independently, they'll need this as they move into GCSEs and revision, and crucially, also in the workplace.





Why are parents/ carers important?

- Research has shown that when parents are engaged with their child's learning they make more progress.
- Children's attitude to homework will be influenced by adults attitude towards it.
- Play a vital role in helping children establish routines, develop self discipline.





Self Quizzing Homework


- To be completed every school night.






- Each term students will be provided with a planner and each term and a knowledge organiser






- Sparx maths is an online homework system which over time looks at a student's responses to questions and will adjust the level of challenge in questions being set going forward.
- Homework is set each Friday at 3pm, due Friday at 3pm.








Student view of homework

- PHS students are expected to complete the "Compulsory" section.
- The "Target" and "XP boost" sections provide more in depth questions but are optional for students.







- This student has completed 80% of task 1 and 25% of task 6.
- 2 tasks have been opened and looked at, while 2 task have not yet been opened.







An example of student work where all tasks have been completed.






- Video clips are provided to help students where they may be struggling. We expect students to use these whilst completing tasks if they need to.
- Direct assistance from parents, whilst useful in the right context, may
 fool the system into thinking the student is doing better than they
 actually are and cause it to set an inappropriate level of questioning
 going forward.













- Bookwork checks are used in Sparx to ensure students are writing out methods and workings, rather than just putting in answers.
- Each question has a bookwork code that students need to record alongside their written work.
- Every so often the system will ask a student to input the bookwork code for a question they answered earlier in the session.
- Failure to do so will result in a bookwork error being reported to the teacher and the student will be asked to repeat the question.
- Students are not expected to bring their workings into school.
 However, if a repeated pattern of failed checks is happening, they may then be asked to show the teacher their work.













• Sparx expectation is that students will complete 100% of their set tasks each week.

The biggest help?

Encouraging your child to start early and not leave everything to the last minute!






Bedrock Vocabulary: what is it?

• Bedrock Vocabulary is an online programme that helps your child learn **new vocabulary**.

• It will help them learn the sort of language they will come across in text books, lessons or exams so has benefits across the curriculum, not just in English lessons.

What do we expect from our pupils?

Each week, students will need to gain a minimum of **20 Bedrock points** before midnight on Sunday Each Monday, English teachers will be emailed a report that looks like this:



- This means they can tell who's been improving their vocabulary and who hasn't.
- House points are awarded for the top 3 points scorers in each class.
- A detention will be issued if a pupil has not achieved 20 points for that week.



Don't forget the drip drip!



- The best way to learn new words is to revisit them over a period of time. Each Bedrock lesson is drip fed every 48 hours.
- This means that your child can't do all of their Bedrock lessons at the last minute on Sunday night!
- A perfect approach looks like this:

Monday – Bedrock lesson 1 Wednesday – Bedrock lesson 2 Friday or any day on the weekend – Bedrock lesson 3



Then they work their way through the lessons.


At the end of each unit, there is another test to see how much progress they've made.

(Post test)



Only correct answers count, you must complete the green ring and get your "present" of XP (points)






• Eg completion date is 17th November 8am. 4 daily goals must be completed between November 11th and 17th.

Once you have registered you can login via the app – available on all platforms.

You **can't go back** and achieve a daily goal, so remember everyday!









How to reset a password:

How many have I completed?


On your homepages on each site, there will be an overview of where you are.
