# **BTEC Level 3 Health & Social Care**



### Who is the course for?

If you have not got your health, what have you got?

You will explore questions such as, how does a disease such as Diabetes, Parkinson's disease or Coronary heart disease impact on the life of individuals. How do you become an effective communicator? How can we ensure that the care system is inclusive and respects diversity?

This course will provide you with transferable knowledge and skills that prepare you for progression to university. Topics that you will study include Equality, Diversity and Rights, Research Methods, Development Stages, Safeguarding, Promoting Health and Wellbeing, amongst other topics. You will consider the real impacts to people living with conditions or illnesses such as the social, financial and psychological impacts, not just the signs, symptoms and treatment of faceless conditions or illnesses. You will also learn about the legislation and guidance supporting health and social care, so that you can ensure the people you are working with are not only able to access all the care and support they are entitled to, but are also able to protect themselves from any harm or abuse.

## Career pathways:

This course naturally links to a range of Health and Social Care careers including: nursing, midwifery, dental care, social work and early years childcare and teaching.
